Message from Inspector Rob Wicks



As the summer draws to a close and winter is rapidly approaching one of the busiest periods for Policing will take place at the end of this month. Halloween and bonfire night offer many of you an opportunity to enjoy yourselves by way of "trick or treating" and hosting or attending firework displays. This time of the year however can cause concern to some people (particularly the elderly) who become scared or intimidated by unexpected visitors or strange noises, please as such be mindful and respectful of others during this time. A general principle to follow on Halloween would be to only attend addresses familiar to yourselves or those with pumpkins or other displays to show they are happy to accept visitors.

If you are planning to enjoy bonfire night, please be mindful of your own safety and only use fireworks following the manufacturer's instructions. Please also consider the safety of your home ensuring doors and windows are secure thereby reducing the risk of being a victim of crime either when at a local display or enjoying fireworks in your garden.

Crime Updates 1st - 30th September 2019

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	2	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Business and Community	0	Business and community Burglaries will include shops, businesses and other property. In general, the purpose for which a building is designed will determine whether it should be classified as 'Residential' or 'Business and Community'.
Burglary Residential	1	Residential Burglary will encompass entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages.
Criminal Damage	8	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	4	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	2	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

The KICKS programme delivered by the Norwich City Community Sports Foundation Norwich City Football Club is funded by the Premier League, with additional support from CSF, KICKS targets young people who have previously proven difficult to reach and helps guide them towards a range of sporting activities, using football as the main engagement tool.

Various workshops and sessions are delivered educating young people on issues they face on a daily basis, which include; sexual health advice, stop smoking advice and CV writing & career advice

Sessions run five nights a week across 13 centres for 40 weeks of the year, with an average of 60 hours of contact time for every participant.
