- (366) Apologies received from Di Carvin & Trevor Wright.
- (367) Minutes of the meeting held 27.5.99 were agreed to be a true record and signed as such by the chairman.

- (359) Appointment of new Councillor. Ron Cornell was duly co-opted as Councillor to replace Peter Dilloway who has taken on the role of Parish Clerk.

- (364) Any Other Business:
(1) The Smell:
Clay Hall Farm are complying with current regulations and for the most part the situation is satisfactory. No processing of fish based products has yet taken place although authorisation for such has been given. The duck Farm in Common Lane is causing offensive odour more frequently The Chairman will contact B.D.C. to establish whether the situation can be improved.
(2) The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 is now in place and parishioners are advised to ring John Barber at Broadland District Council Environmental Health Dept., giving the name of the offender the time and the place. Anonymity is assured. It is likely that in the first instance a warning letter would be sent. Failure to clear up after a dog now carries a £1000 fine.
(3) It would appear that no budget is yet available for assessment for a pedestrian crossing. The council will continue to pursue this. It does seem likely that if permission were given the parish would need to provide some of the funding.
(4) Some concern was expressed that if the siting of the marquee at the hotel is regularised, noise pollution may become more prevalent. If there is a problem parishioners should inform the council.
(5) Recycling banks. If any of the containers are full please inform the parish council or ring 01603 703302 to have them emptied.
(6) Steve Norris having stood down as councillor the Chairman thanked him for his past work and requested the clerk to inform B.D.C. that a vacancy exists.
