WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

I hope everyone is well and enjoying life returning to some form of normality as lockdown restrictions are gradually eased.

The last month has been a busy one with the main issues reported being anti-social behaviour on our area in parks and open spaces. This has resulted with increased patrols, including plain clothes and high visibility patrols, to deal with any issues in the area. It has also been great to get out and about and engage with members of the public whilst on patrol.

In line with our priority settings we are also conducting speed enforcement checks and working on fraud prevention. We're taking part in online teams meetings as well as providing support and advice to members of the public, who want advice around fraud and online scams. We have been providing 'No Cold Caller' stickers and leaflets - if anyone requires any of these please contact us so we can provide these.

We will continue our work around the agreed priorities over the coming month as well as trying to get out on patrol as much as possible. If you see us out and about please come and say hello.

CRIME UPDATES 1st to 30th April

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	2	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	5	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	4	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	1	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
